County Archery Shoot Held on Sunday

In a very competitive archery shoot, 38 youth competed to capture their place on the Morgan County Archery Team who will compete at the State 4-H Shooting Sports Contests in August. It was held at the Morgan County Fairgrounds on Sunday, July 18, 2021. Youth have participated in practices held by certified 4-H archery instructors for the past three months in preparation for the county fair shoot.

In the junior recurve traditional, Soul Keller placed 1st; Rylan Schreiner, 2nd; Elizabeth Whitney, 3rd; Saxson Keller, 4th; and Jacob Whitney, 5th.

Travis Hall was first in the junior archery compound limited class. Carston Johnson placed 2nd; Riley Thomas, 3rd; Wyatt Chacon, 4th; Tenleigh Lorenzini, 5th; and Axel Lorenzini, 6th. Other youth participating were Dillon Curtis, Aiden Midcap, and Anna Werner. Rhett Curtis won the senior division, followed by Allison Thomas, 2nd; Grayson Johnson, 3rd; Mikaela Thiel, 4th; Jordyn Garcia, 5th; and Kirsten Powell, 6th. Also competing as seniors were Madison Thomas, Riley Hughes, Americo Lorenzini, Cole Curtis, Ceri Dixon and Chloe Cuckow.

The junior archery compound traditional competition was led by Katelyn Johnson, followed by Wyatt Gorrell, 2nd; Cole Koch, 3rd; Rylee Stevens, 4th; Seth Whitney, 5th; and Cason Tow, 6th. Also competing as a junior was Evan Ferguson and Kaylea Ferguson. Competing in the senior division of Compound Traditional was Max Curtis, placing first.

The final archery class shot during the 2021 Morgan County Fair Archery Contest was Compound Bow Unlimited. Coming in first in the junior age group was Aysli Kembel in second place. Madeline Kembel came in first place in the senior age division and Baylei Kembel was second.

Superintendents for the archery shoot were Paul Oliveria, and Levi Dixon, Jesse Koch, Chad and Katie Lorenzini, and Stefani Oliveria assisted with the shoot.
