DEMONSTRATION CONTEST CHAMPIONS NAMED

A busy Thursday at the Fair included the dog show, Creative Cooks and wrapping up with the 4-H Demonstration Contest. Top winners in the Demonstration Contest were Zoey Sneed, Grand Champion Senior Demonstration, Landon Crispin, Grand Champion Intermediate Demonstration, and Tyson Fox, Grand Champion Junior Demonstration.

In the Senior Demonstration division at the Morgan County Fair, Grand Champion was Zoey Sneed with her demonstration on “What Feed Do You Need” for a show goat. Reserve Grand Champion went to Laura Kopetzky for her demonstration titled “The Basics of Recycling”.

In the Intermediate division, Landon Crispin received Grand Champion with his demonstration on “What You Need for a Successful Hike”.

In the Junior Division, Tyson Fox received Grand Champion with his demonstration, “Air Rifle Range Safety”. Haylee Amen received Reserve Grand Champion for her demonstration describing “The Daily Care of a Goat.”

Youth can represent Morgan County at the State Demonstration Contest which will be held on August 28 and 29 in Pueblo during the Colorado State Fair.
