2023-2024 4-H Enrollment

- 4-H Online enrollment is open at <u>https://v2.4honline.com/</u>. (Make sure you are using this website, otherwise you will get an error.)
- Youth and adults must enroll each year they want to participate.
- Enrollment cost for 2023-2024, will be at \$20 per youth, including cloverbuds (5-7 year olds), payable by cash, check or card to the Morgan County Extension Fund (NO online payment available.) Shooting Sports members will have an additional \$10 per youth fee.
- Enrollment closes February 1, 2024 to be eligible to participate in the 2024 Morgan County Fair.

"I DARE YOU!" AWARDS

Ethan Bohl Raelynn Carlock Delaney Draegert Danielle Moon

Considered to be one of the most important selfhelp books ever written, "I Dare You!" was first published in 1931 by William Danforth, the founder of the Ralston-Purina pet food company and the American Youth Foundation. Danforth was a successful entrepreneur who spent much of his life helping and counseling young people and founded a youth camp in Michigan dedicated to mentoring youth. In this influential work, he expounded on his belief that a healthy and productive life depended on keeping four important elements in balance. These elements were physical, mental, social, and religious. A person must develop each element individually, but must not focus on one element to the detriment of the others.

Danforth also believed in the importance of dedicating one's attention and efforts to the task at hand and treating each job and day as the most important one ever.

Danforth never approached any challenge with less than complete attention and he inspired countless young people with his unwavering enthusiasm and determination. "I Dare You!" is a timeless classic that will encourage everyone to face life's challenges with a determined spirit.

- Enrollment opened October 1, 2023 and closes February 1, 2024 to be eligible to participate in the 2024 Morgan County Fair.
- Encourage a friend to join.
- Step-by-step instructions to help you enroll are posted on the Morgan County 4-H website under 4-H Enrollment.
- Each family will log in using their family email address and password to enroll electronically. <u>If</u> you don't remember your family email to start this process, please email coopext morgan@mail.colostate.edu. (Do not create a duplicate account.)
- Signatures for the forms are electronic. AN ELECTRONIC SIGNATURE IS TYPING THE FIRST AND LAST NAME OF THE INDIVIDUAL.
- Once families submit their enrollment, Organizational (Club) Leaders will be notified of the enrollment. The staff in our county will view and approve each enrollment, once payment is received and approval from the Organizational Leader is granted.
- Families will continue to be able to make some changes throughout the year such as address, email address, phone number, etc. You can add or drop a project after your initial enrollment by emailing coopext_morgan@mail.colostate.edu prior to May 15, 2024.
- Changing clubs is not allowed once enrollment is approved.
- 4-H volunteers must enroll in 4-H Online every year.

Morgan County 4-H Funding Committee DBA LAC 2022-2023

Youth must participate in fundraisers in the 4-H year (Oct 2022-Sept 2023) to be eligible to receive funding from LAC for activities in the next 4-H year (Oct 2023-Sept 2024). This is done by selling 4 items of any fundraisers (butter braids or peaches). If youth did not sell 4 items, \$25 may be contributed by December 31, 2023 to be eligible for funding.

Youth who did not sell 4 items or contribute \$25 for the 4-H year (Oct 2022-Sept 2023) will receive a letter in the mail as a reminder they will not receive funding for activities in the next 4-H year (Oct 2023-Sept 2024).


Livestock Judging

Workouts for Livestock Judging normally start in early March. Generally, the team will also compete in several county contests prior to the State contest in June, held in conjunction with the State 4-H Conference in Fort Collins. Team members will learn livestock evaluation skills for beef, goats, sheep and swine. Top placing teams have the opportunity to participate in national level contests. Horse Judging

Learn the basics of how to evaluate a horse shown in halter and performance as well as give oral reasons to an official judge justifying how you placed a specific class of horses. Livestock Information



Premises ID

Premises identification will provide quick and accurate traceability of livestock and locations in the event of an animal health concern, which will help maintain the health of all Colorado livestock. For this program, a premises is defined as a location or site where livestock are born, handled, housed, managed, marketed, processed, or exhibited. Premises ID is managed by the Colorado Department of Agriculture.

For the 2023 – 2024 project year, 4-H members with livestock projects (beef, dairy, goat, horse, sheep, swine, poultry, and rabbit) are strongly encouraged to obtain a Premises ID. It is required to exhibit at the Morgan County Fair and Colorado State Fair. It is also required for other livestock shows.

If you don't already have a Premises ID, you can obtain one by calling Marlin 542-3543 or go online to Colorado Location Identification (LID) Registration Form at <u>http://col.st/tzSZP</u>.

Animal Care and Housing Form

All 4-H members with animal projects will be required to have a completed, signed and approved animal Care and Housing Form for Colorado 4-H Livestock Projects form on file at the Extension Office. This form will be provided in two ways:

1. 4-H online for those that have their animals at their place of residence and

2. on our 4-H Website <u>http://morgan.extension.colostate.edu</u> for those that have their animals some place other than their residence.

If your animal project is housed at your place of residence you filled out this form while filling out your paperwork during the enrollment process online.

If your animal project is not housed at your place of residence then you will need to go to our 4-H Website, print the Animal Care and Housing form and fill out both sides of that form. This gives us additional information about your specific situation and helps with the approval process. Please give us detailed information or we will send them back for you to adjust your comments. Talk to your club leader, or contact Marlin at 542-3543 if you have any questions.

Catch-It animals will only be distributed to those members that are enrolled and paid.

Catch-It Calf Distribution

Calves will be distributed in **November** or **December**. Participants will receive an email with details. Participants, who feel they cannot fulfill their commitment, please notify Marlin immediately.

2024 HORSE ID'S

Due May 1, 2024 by 4:00 pm.

All Members with Horses are required to fill out ID's in 4-H Online, yearly. Three views of Horse are required.

If you identified a horse last year, you must activate each animal account.

Primary Care of Horses begins May 1, 2024.

This includes leased horses. Check with Marlin if you have questions.



BREEDING HEIFERS TO BE AWARDED TO QUALIFIED YOUTH

Deadline: December 1, 2023

The Morgan County Cattlemen's Association will donate two breeding heifers to two Morgan County 4-H/FFA youth that will be selected by their Board of Directors. Interested youth must submit a letter stating why they should be considered, to the Extension Office (Attn: Marlin Eisenach) no later than December 1 by 4 p.m. The heifers will be distributed early this winter.



- 1) Must be a Morgan County 4-H or FFA member in good standing.
- 2) Have adequate facilities, source of feed and experience with breeding beef.
- 3) Work with the Association to breed the heifer.
- 4) Recommended that the participant exhibits the heifer at the 2024 Morgan County Fair.
- 5) Include in your letter:
 - a) calculate cost of feed from January 1 until the heifer calves
 - b) how you will acquire these resources,
 - c) how it will be financed
 - d) include parent/guardian signature

The heifer will become the sole property of the recipient after the heifer calves or unless there are extenuating circumstances.

MCCA has the right to reject any or all applications.



Selecting and Starting a Market Beef Project



Over the next few months many of you will be selecting a calf for your market beef project to be shown at your county fair next year. The decisions you make now have a tremendous effect on the success of your overall project. There are many important things to consider when you begin the project. First of all, with the increased cost of purchasing a calf and higher feed costs you need to be sure that you have the financial backing to be able to successfully complete the project. On the conservative side, you can have over \$1500 invested in your beef project and may well expect to spend over \$2500 purchasing and feeding your calf.

Family ID Rule

 Family nominations for market animals will be accepted. To be eligible for family nominations, the nominated livestock must:

1. Be owned by exhibitors of the same immediate family and residing in the same household.

2. Be nominated by the ID deadline set by the Morgan County Fair Board.

3. Be in continuous care of the exhibitors residing in the same household.

4. Individual ownership of the family nominated animal MUST be declared prior to weighing the animal at the County Fair weigh-in.


