In a very competitive archery shoot, 29 youth competed to capture their place on the Morgan County 4-H Archery Team who will compete at the State 4-H Shooting Sports Contests in August. It was held at the Morgan County Fairgrounds on Sunday, July 13, 2025. Youth have participated in practices held by certified 4-H archery instructors for the past three months in preparation for the County Fair shoot.

In the Senior Recurve Traditional, Jacob Whitney placed 1st and Elizabeth Whitney, 2nd.

Wyatt Johnson was first in the junior archery compound traditional class. Erica Hess placed 2nd; Wesson Farnik, 3rd; Jaxson Stevens, 4th; Ella Farnik, 5th. The junior archery compound limited competition was led by Seth Whitney, followed by Raylan Neal, 2nd; Teagan Clark, 3rd; Jaden Baker, 4th; Edward Arndt, 5th. Also competing as a junior was Logan Jarrell and Cora Paris. For the senior age group in archery compound limited, Wyatt Chacon came in 1st; Kirstin Powell, 2nd; Anna Werner, 3rd; Cason Tow, 4th; Dillon Curtis, 5th. Rylee Stevens, Wyatt Gorrell, and KyLee Waller also competed with the seniors.
