The Morgan County 4-H Foundation is a 501c3 that provides essential funding for 4-H programs throughout Colorado. Individuals, corporations, and the 4-H Foundation are all partners in supporting the youth who take part in various 4-H activities throughout the state.

The 4-H program spread to Morgan County in 1914. G.M. McCord was the first Extension Agent in the County and began "Corn Clubs" that fall. For these clubs, youth grew an acre of irrigated or dry land corn. Top growers received either a corn sheller or a Duroc pig. Fifteen youth were involved.

Soon after, Morgan County hired a Home Economist who started clubs where girls learned cooking, home management, and sewing.

Today there are 16 4-H clubs in Morgan County and over 250 youth involved. Additionally, there are over 600 youth participating yearly in School Enrichment and After School programs making 4-H the largest youth organization in Morgan County.
